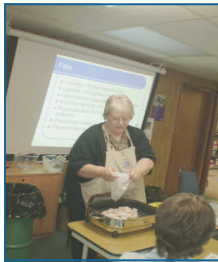

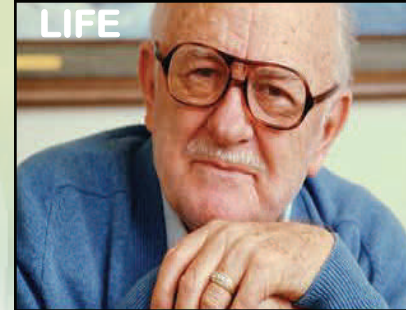

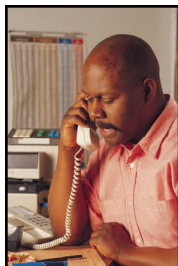
What Is An ADRC?

An ADRC is a single, coordinated system of information and access where senior citizens, persons with disabilities and concerned family members can access long term services and supports, regardless of age, disability or income. It combines aging and disability services and assistance because both populations have similar needs. Through a coordinated system of partnering agencies, the ADRC is able to promote a “one stop shop” concept for a seamless delivery of services. An ADRC is a welcoming environment where you and your family can access information and a wide variety of services.

An ADRC can assist:

- ◆ individuals and families needing either public or private resources
- ◆ individuals and families planning for their future long-term care needs
- ◆ professionals seeking assistance on behalf of their clients
- ◆ individuals with chronic conditions and /or disabilities who are being discharged to avoid unnecessary readmission to the hospital

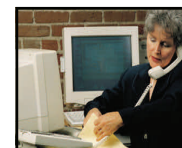

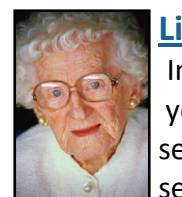
Senior Medicare Patrol
